We are so grateful for the kind words and contributions that the community has given to us in the **wake of the devastating burglary** of our construction site in mid-June. We are still working with our insurance company on our damage claim that currently stands at over \$180,000. Until the insurance claim is settled, there is little we can do inside the building.

But, if you've driven by the site recently, you will notice that **Planting Justice (PJ)** is working on the outdoor nursery space. We are also busy acquiring kitchen equipment for the cafe AND for the Planting Justice production kitchen that will be managed by **Sam Lustig**, formerly of Swanton Berry Farm. (see bio on pg. 2)

We are also delighted to announce that we will be receiving some additional coffee equipment from **Salesforce** including a ModBar AV under counter espresso machine that used to be installed in the coffee bar on the top floor of the iconic Saleforce tower in San Francisco. A good espresso machine is an essential (and expensive) piece of equipment when operating a coffee shop and we are very excited to receive this beautiful (and eventually delicious!) donation. Big kudos to Good Table Cafe Board member **Jason Daniel** and to our new friend **Tom Bake**r from Salesforce for making this happen!

The Contra Costa Sheriff is finally investigating this large loss and we are grateful, although finding the thieves will not put our rough electrical back in the walls. Some will find it interesting that the detective assigned to our case is also working to stem the tide of **catalytic converter** thefts. The two crimes are related because both take their ill gotten goods to unscrupulous metal recyclers. In addition to making food justice his priority in professional life, he received his degree in Political Science from the University of California Santa Cruz with a focus on poverty and welfare politics. His lifelong passion for food led to a venture in heliciculture (snail farming) and the beginnings of his side project, Sam's Snail Farm, with the goal to become the first certified organic producer of escargot in the country.

As brother in law to co-directors and co-founders of Planting Justice Gavin Raders and Haleh Zandi, he has watched PJ grow from the seed of an idea into the food justice institution it is today. His longtime experience in socially just farm to table retail, production and design at Swanton Berry Farm and his commitment to outreach and education on labor inequities and the injustices of America's food system is what has led Sam to join Planting Justice and the Good Table project. When the church first began dreaming about creating The Good Table as a new way of being a spiritual community, we used a business tool called The Lean Canvas to help us think about things differently and not just fall into the same old, same old ways of being church that we've known in the past.

The Lean Canvas has nine "blocks" that make you think about a new project in a different way. One of them, the "unfair advantage" block has turned out to be one of the best blocks for our project because it reminded us of our commitment to and our ability to work in partnership with other nonprofit organizations.

The partnership between The Good Table United Church of Christ and Planting Justice is essential to this project. Without the legacy capital from the church to buy the property and PJ's ability to fundraise for the renovation, this project would not be possible. Neither organization could do this by ourselves.

While our partnership with PJ is more formal, our church has always sought to work with other partners - both faith-based and secular nonprofits - to serve the wider community.

On Saturday, July 16th, council member Mary Ivas and I went to the 14th Annual Put the Guns Down event sponsored by the Visions of Hope Project led by Pastor Elana Bolds, a longtime community activist in Richmond that Melinda met through City of Refuge, UCC, Oakland.

At the event there was free food, haircuts, games, a bounce house, and a bicycle giveaway aimed at helping families and children stay away from gun violence. The projects does this work year 'round and it is impossible to guess how many lives have been saved. The Good Table UCC is proud to have sponsored this event for the last two years and we look forward to finding new ways to support at-risk children in our area by working with Pastor Elana and her fabulous organization.
