#### The Good Table Café and Nursery News

As many of you know, but perhaps isn't always clear to new folks, our site at 5166 Sobrante Avenue will be home for four nonprofit organizations: 1) The Good Table LLC (GTLLC), which owns the property and is jointly-owned by 2) Planting Justice (PJ) and 3) The Good Table United Church of Christ (GTUCC). 4) The Good Table Café (GTCAFE) is the entity founded by members of GTUCC that will operate our paywhat-you-can and pay-it-forward coffeeshop/café, local food and craft marketplace and a separate and beautiful gathering space for live music, educational workshops, and pay-whatyou-can yoga and whatever programming the community wants to offer and attend.

We hope that all our gathering space offerings will also be available through **live-streaming and video conferencing** once we can afford all the equipment to connect to the cables we are installing for this purpose while the walls are still open. The gathering space will also be home for **GTUCC's regular gatherings** and for PJ's educational events and will eventually house the abstract and lovely stained glass from GTUCC's former campus in El Cerrito. Church activities will include our weekly **Sunday gathering with music, prayer, and preaching**, our **spiritual book group called Live Edge Readers**, and various other programs for spiritual development and mindfulness including our Interfaith meditation group. All these programs are currently available via zoom and our Sunday gathering meets in person and via zoom.

**Planting Justice** will operate an **organic tree and plant nursery and urban farmstore** with supplies for beekeepers, gray water harvesting, seeds and more! PJ will also have a **production kitchen onsite** to manufacture jams, jellies, honey, medicinal tinctures, and even baked goods including pie!

## **Greens to the People**

The Good Table Café (GTCAFE) Board of Directors was recently asked to be a nonprofit sponsor for a local feeding program we're now calling "Greens to the People" Staffed for over six years by a faithful group of local volunteers led by **Susie Haas** and **Melanie Mentzel**, this group picks up "leftover" produce and grocery items that would otherwise be wasted from Whole Foods Market each week and distributes the items to needy folks in the El Sobrante community.

Little programs like this are great ways to help reduce the outrageous amount of food waste in this nation. According to Feeding America, over 108 billion tons of food are wasted each year. Food waste is high quality food that is thrown away for a variety of reasons including: uneaten food that is thrown out at homes, stores, and restaurants; crops left in fields because of low crop prices or too many of the same crops being available; problems during the manufacturing and transportation of food; and/or food not meeting retailers' standards for color and appearance.
